Now and in the next few months, your child will:

- ♥ Hop on one foot
- ♥ Draw a face
- ♥ Know colors
- ♥ Dress self with little help
- ♥ Have greater skill with fingers so she can play games that have little pieces
- ♥ Be very boastful
- ♥ Talk to other children more than to adults
- ♥ Be able to play at one task for longer periods of time
- ♥ Increase his ability to be self-motivated
- ♥ Like tricking you by hiding and playing games
- ♥ Have difficulty with nap time but may still need rest
- ♥ Understand "good" and "bad"
- ♥ Need considerable praise

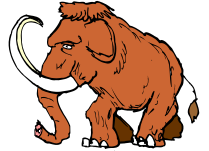


TOYS OF INTEREST

- ♥ Climbing equipment

- ♥ Trucks, cars, wagons

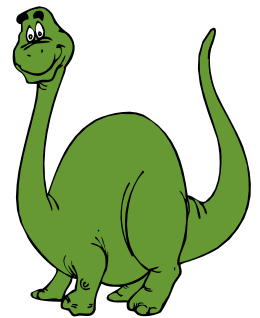
PARENTING HINTS

- ♥ As at all stages, reading is important. It isn't just to teach her words and how to read, it is also to teach her to be a quiet listener.
- ♥ Encourage him to do things on his own. In a brief time he will be expected to be able to use the bathroom and put on his coat by himself. Be sure to start now.
- ♥ The best motivator at this age is success.
- ♥ This is a period of slightly greater fear toward those in authority. She may need extra help in feeling good about her efforts. Hug her and praise her. Her successes help her feel worthwhile. Her view of herself is constantly changing. You help her by loving and accepting her.
- ♥ His ability to tell the difference between a fantasy and a lie is not good and, like most things, it will get better later.
- ♥ Make sure your child is comfortable being away from you. Encourage her independence to help her be ready for school.
- ♥ This can be a very demanding period. It takes a lot of energy to parent at every stage and may take even more right now. Take a break or go out with your partner. Be sure to put your child to bed early both for her sake and for yours. You need time alone or with your partner.
