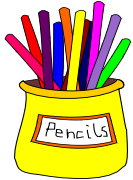


YOUR FIVE YEAR OLD



Now and in the next few months, your child will:

- ♥ Draw a person with body and legs
- ♥ Name four colors and count 10 objects
- ♥ Skip
- ♥ Know some or all of the days of the week
- ♥ Try to tie shoes and buttons and zips jacket
- ♥ Build a simple structure with blocks or cubes
- ♥ Have a clear hand preference for eating, throwing, etc.
- ♥ Follow two and three part directions (Go upstairs, get me a diaper, and bring it here.)
- ♥ Feed and dress himself
- ♥ Play cooperatively regularly
- ♥ Talk about ideas
- ♥ Try to color within the lines
- ♥ Be eager to help

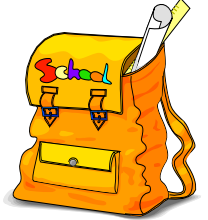


TOYS OF INTEREST

- ♥ Books about animals in people's roles
- ♥ Roller skates ♥ Bicycles ♥ Money, real or pretend ♥ Real office machines-calculators
- ♥ Blankets and tables for tents

PARENTING HINTS

- ♥ Fives begin to become very self-centered but bare with her. Try not to cause her to feel guilty because she needs to go through this period before she can be more involved with others.
- ♥ Your five year old has become calmer. Maybe that is why kindergarten begins at this age.
- ♥ At this age, he begins to form lasting friendships usually with children he thinks are most like him.
- ♥ Her fears are changing. No longer is she fearful of the dark but now more likely of the monsters in the dark.
- ♥ Calendar activities work now because he has more understanding of time and space.
- ♥ You may see an interest in science as your child goes into a more factual period. Bugs, stars, electricity take on new meaning for her.
- ♥ Don't let planning for kindergarten lessen the fun of this age. Letters, writing and numbers will all come with time. Experiences are what he still needs.
- ♥ Despite her age she will still enjoy being home with you.
- ♥ Help him look forward to school by visiting a kindergarten class or attending events at the school. Be excited with and for him as he begins this exciting adventure.
